

The *Angolite* began in 1953 as a weekly 8–12-page tabloid under the hand of William "Old Wooden Ear" Sadler. In 1975 it was converted to a magazine format and began the most significant experiment in prison journalism.

The result is a relevant, bi-monthly nationally circulated news magazine that has earned some

of the nation's most coveted press awards.
